KOJIMA Zenzaburo (1893-1962), Japanese Western-Style painter born in Hakata is known for colorful and energetic paintings based on Japanese tradition and effort to create Japanese-style oil paintings instead of mimicking Western methods. This exhibition commemorating the 130th anniversary of his birth will highlight not only his great contribution and works during the prewar period as the charisma of the Dokuritsu Fine Arts Society established in 1930, but also a series of postwar landscape paintings and decorative still life paintings to reexamine the meaning of his paintings.
