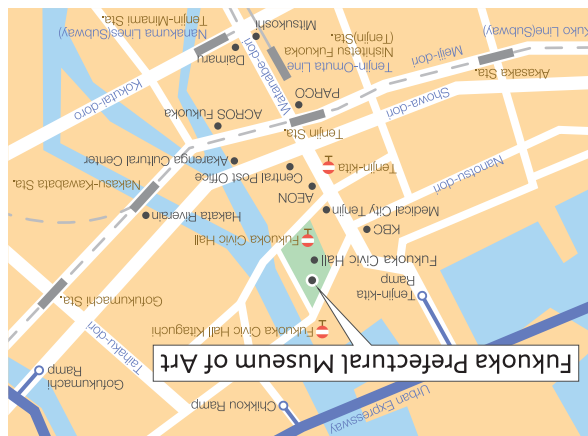

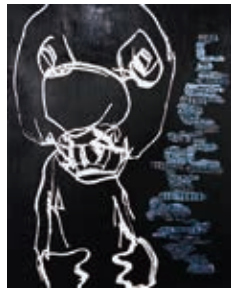

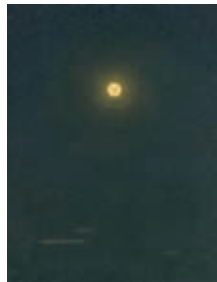

TAKASHIMA Yajuro is a Western-style painter from Kurume City who has painted such works as "Candle" and "Moon" with his unique realistic brushstrokes. This exhibition, which will be held on the 50th anniversary of his death, is the largest retrospective of his work to date, and will feature approximately 150 of his works, some of which will be on display for the first time. The exhibition traces the roots of Yajuro's artistic style and the Buddhist philosophy that guided him throughout his life, while also highlighting his personality and the true essence of his art.
